The space race between Russia and USA to land a 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The Industrial Revolution was a time when Britain was changing to a land of big factories instead of farms. The railways that were built in these times made Britain the richest in the world. The first locomotive George Stephenson built in 1814 was called 'Blucher'. It could travel at 4 miles per hour. Railroads were first built to transport coal around the country. However, in 1825, the first railway for passengers was opened. It could carry more than 450 people and travelled at 15mph. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Mary Seacole was a nurse. Her mother was Jamaican and her father was Scottish. She travelled from Jamaica to look after wounded soldiers on the battlefield in the Crimean War. She set up a hospital called the British Hotel to look after soldiers. Florence Nightingale was a nurse. She made hospitals cleaner for patients and looked after soldiers in the Crimean War. She set up the Nightingale Training School for nurses in 1860. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Which buildings in Speen are old and new. The way people travel in the local area has changed over time. Tudor houses are black and white because of the wooden frames. Many of them have thatched roofs. Victorian houses were made from brick or local stone. The uses for buildings can change over time. Buildings have changed a lot over time as new materials and technology have been developed.
