English

Handwriting

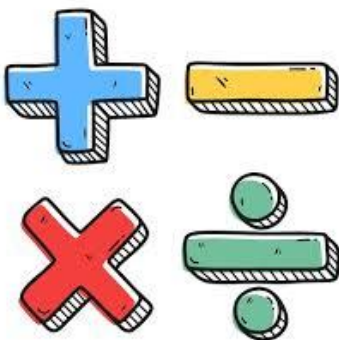
Year 2 will continue to work on their joins, particularly horizontal joins. Year 2 writing is getting much better and much neater, please try to encourage joining as much as possible at home. Year 1 will work on their letter sizing and how we write our capitals larger than lower case letters, along with orientation of numbers - particular letters which are causing trouble at the moment are d, b, n, a, m, e, f, g and y - both capital and lower case.

Maths

Year 1

We will be continuing our unit, 'Addition and Subtraction within 20'.

In this unit we will:



- Add by counting on within 20
- Add ones using number bonds
- Find and make number bonds to 20
- Work on doubles and near doubles
- Subtract ones using number bonds
- Subtraction - counting back
- Subtraction - finding the difference Related facts
- Missing number problems

Year 2

We are continuing our unit 'Multiplication and Division'.

In this unit we will:

- Begin to recognise, make and add equal groups

- Introduce the multiplication symbol
- Work with multiplication sentences and arrays
- Make equal groups - grouping
- Make equal groups - sharing
- Work with the 2 times-table to then multiply and divide by 2
- Build on our doubling and halving
- Work with odd and even numbers
- The 10 times-table to then multiply and divide by 10
- The 5 times-table to multiply and divide by 5

Science

For science this week we will be looking back at what we have covered this term.

PE

For P.E this week we will recap our gymnastics from this term and create a sequence of movements.

Topic

This week for Topic we will be working in groups to create proposed 'for/against' arguments for building Mary Seacole and Florence Nightingale statues outside a hospital, using our knowledge from this term to back up our arguments.
