
Bramley Class Weekly Overview

Week Commencing 29th September 2025

<u>English</u>

We are continuing our text for this term, How to Find Gold. This week we will be using the illustrations from the book to create a visual narrative with role play and beginning to think about writing narratives.



Phonics (Year I) - We will be reviewing all graphemes taught this year.

Phonics/spellings (Year 2) - moving on to the different sounds for 'i/igh/y'.

Year 1

This week we are comparing numbers, finding more, less, greater than and less than, and using our numberlines to help us to solve problems.

- I more / I less
- Less than/greater than/equal to
- Using a number line

Key Vocabulary

One more, one less, tens, ones, after, before.

Year 2

This week we will be looking at how we compare and estimate, and we will also be building on our counting in 2s, 5s and 10s.

In this unit we will:

- Use numbers to 20
- · Count objects to 100 by making tens
- Recognise tens and ones
- Use a place value chart
- Partition numbers to 100
- Write numbers to 100 in words
- Count in 10s and 1s on a number line

Key Vocabulary

Count in steps, count in multiples, place value, estimate, compare

This week in science we will be investigating the meanings of 'Transparent' and 'Opaque' and identifying these features in different materials.
