English

We will be drafting and writing our own poetry this week, using metaphors and similes, which we learnt about last week.



Phonics

Year 1 will continue their work on Phase 5 phonics and spellings. Year 2 will also continue with their spellings, working through some harder words. In class we will also focus on 'Prickly' words - words which are difficult to spell and which don't always follow the spelling rules.

Handwriting


We will continue to work on our joins, letter orientation and ensuring we start to join all writing automatically if we are in Year 2. We will also focus on capital letters and their size comparison to lower case letters.

Maths

Year 1

We will be continuing our unit, 'Addition and Subtraction within 20'.

In this unit we will:



- Add by counting on within 20
- Add ones using number bonds
- Find and make number bonds to 20
- Work on doubles and near doubles
- Subtract ones using number bonds
- Subtraction - counting back
- Subtraction - finding the difference Related facts
- Missing number problems

Year 2

We are continuing our unit 'Multiplication and Division'.

In this unit we will:

- Begin to recognise, make and add equal groups
- Introduce the multiplication symbol
- Work with multiplication sentences and arrays
- Make equal groups - grouping

- Make equal groups - sharing
- Work with the 2 times-table to then multiply and divide by 2
- Build on our doubling and halving
- Work with odd and even numbers
- The 10 times-table to then multiply and divide by 10
- The 5 times-table to multiply and divide by 5

Science

For science this week we will be identifying differences between species, and thinking about certain species classifications - for example, we know that fish have scales, gills and fins,

PE

This term, our P.E unit will be gymnastics. We will focus on agility, balance, speed, stamina and coordination.

Topic

This week for Topic we will look back at everything we have learnt about Mary Seacole and discussing why we think she is special.

RE

This week we will continue to learn about the Jewish faith, focussing on how the Shema affects a Jewish person's everyday life.
